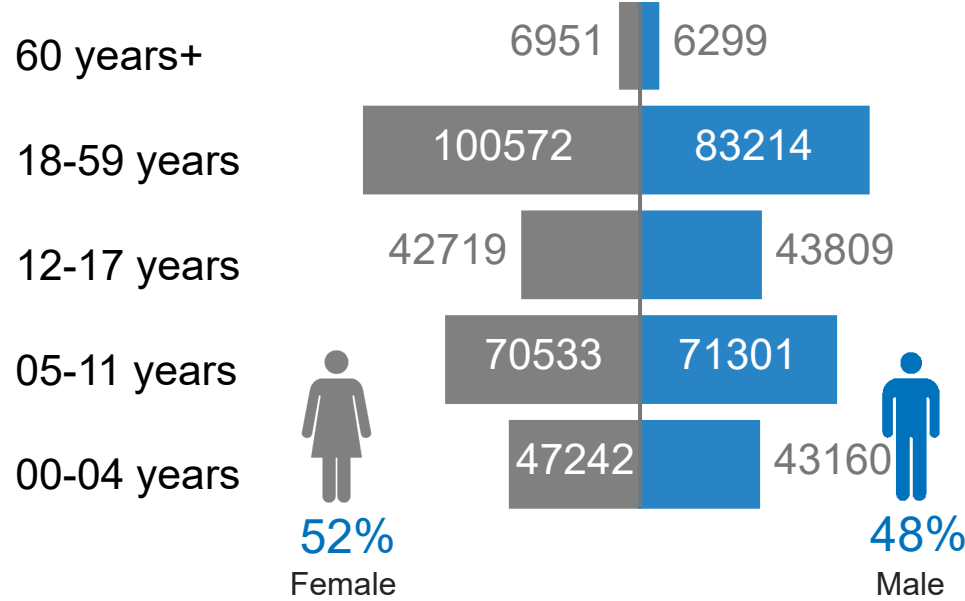

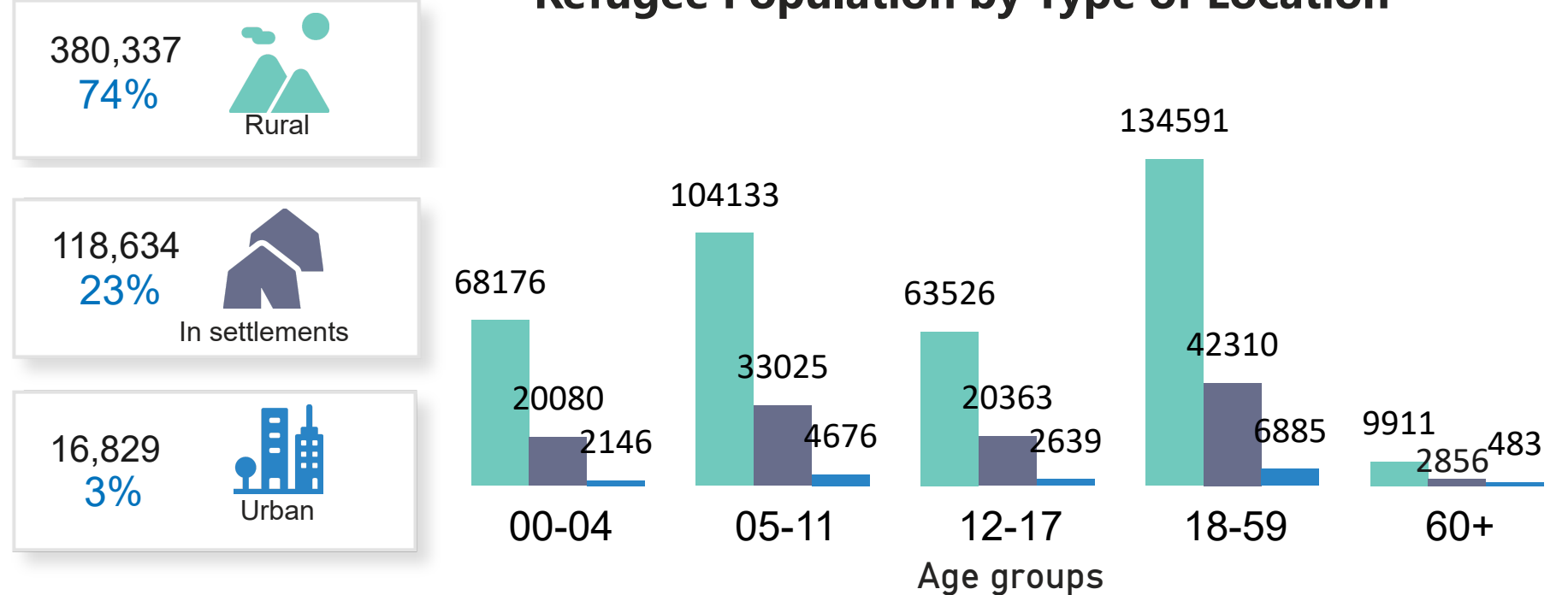
Situation Overview

During this period, the refugee population in DRC decreased slightly from 518,303 on 05/31/2022 to 515,800 on 06/30/2022, a decrease of 2,503 refugees from the total population. The number of asylum seekers decreased from 3,463 on 05/31/2022 to 2,705 on 06/30/2022 (64 Central Africans, 1,434 Burundians, 110 Rwandans, 761 South Sudanese and 336 other nationalities).

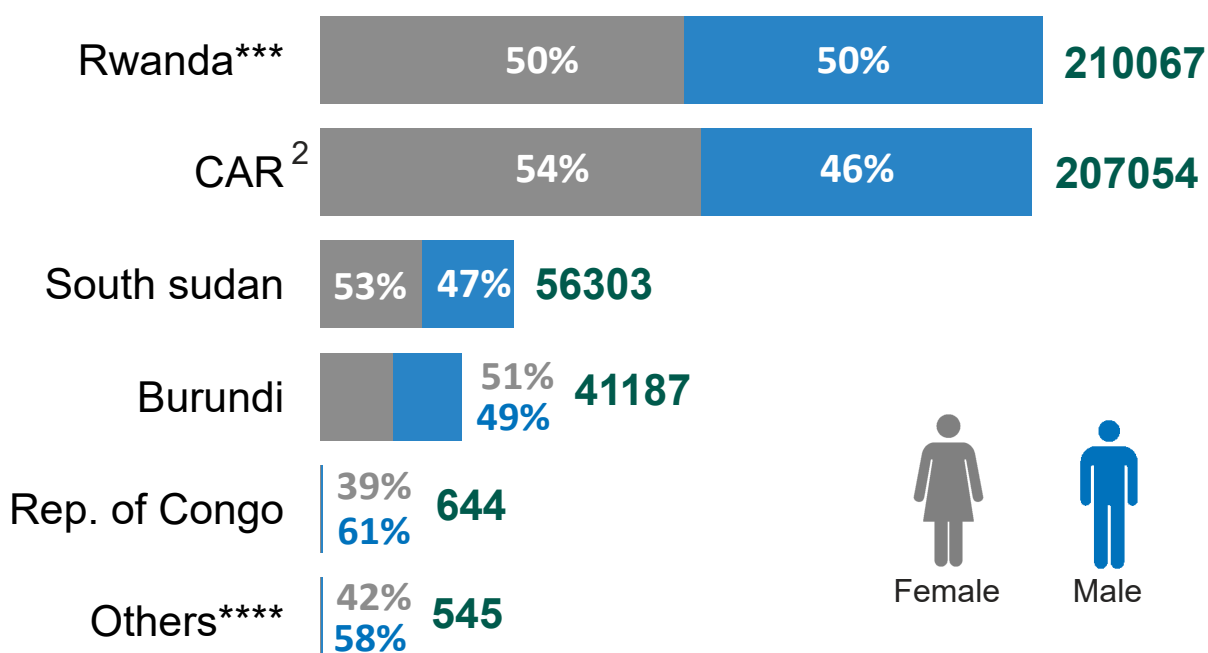
Age and Gender of Refugee Population

Refugee Population by Country of Origin

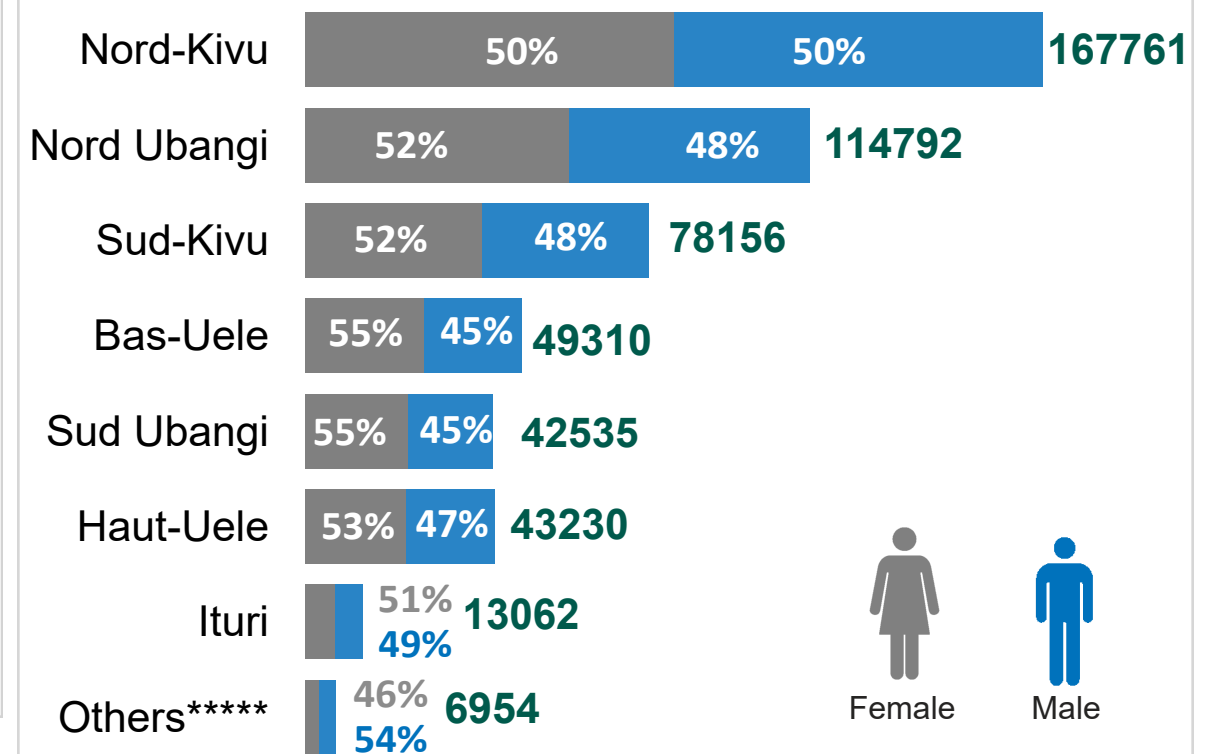

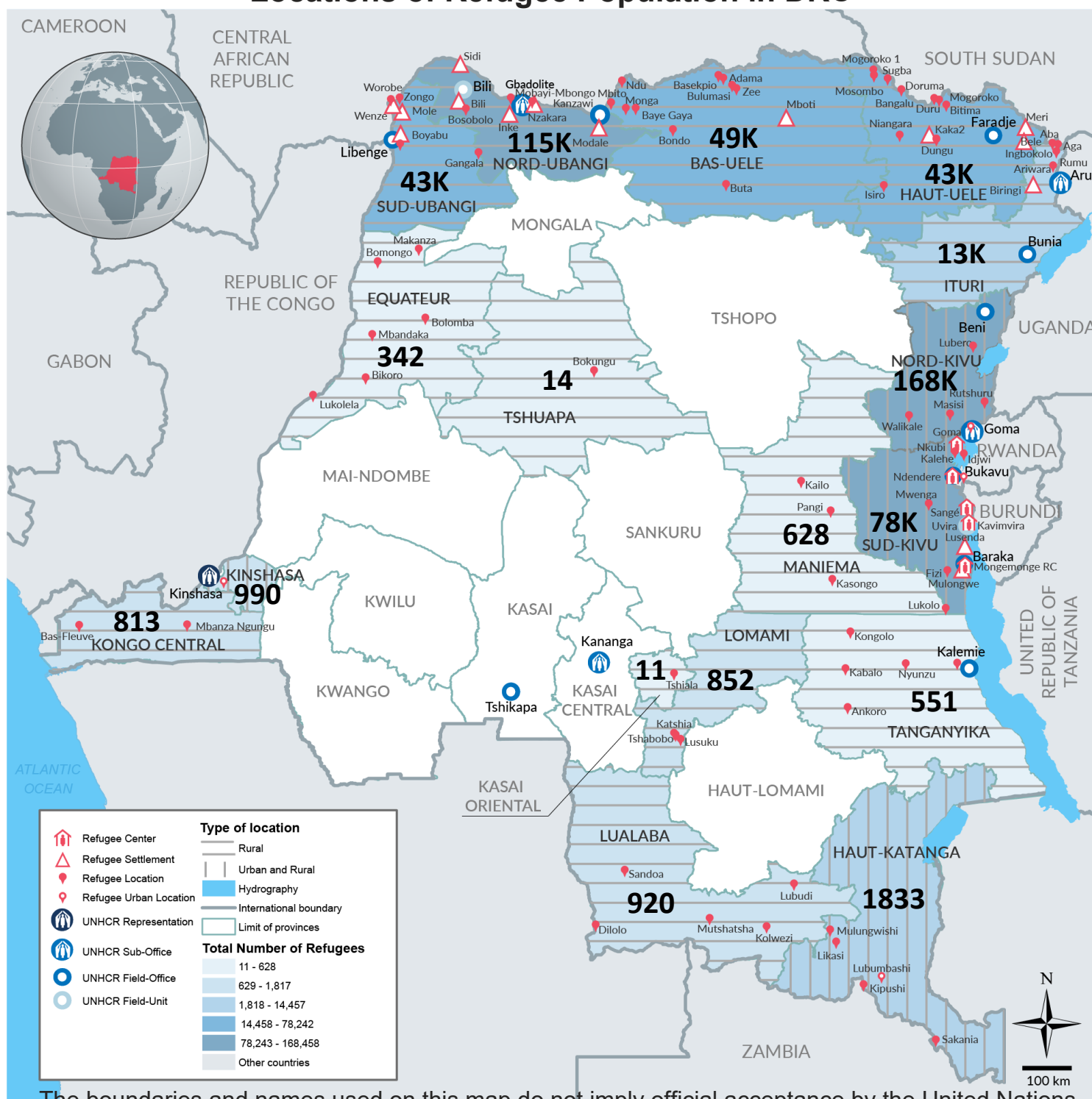

Refugee Population by Province in DRC

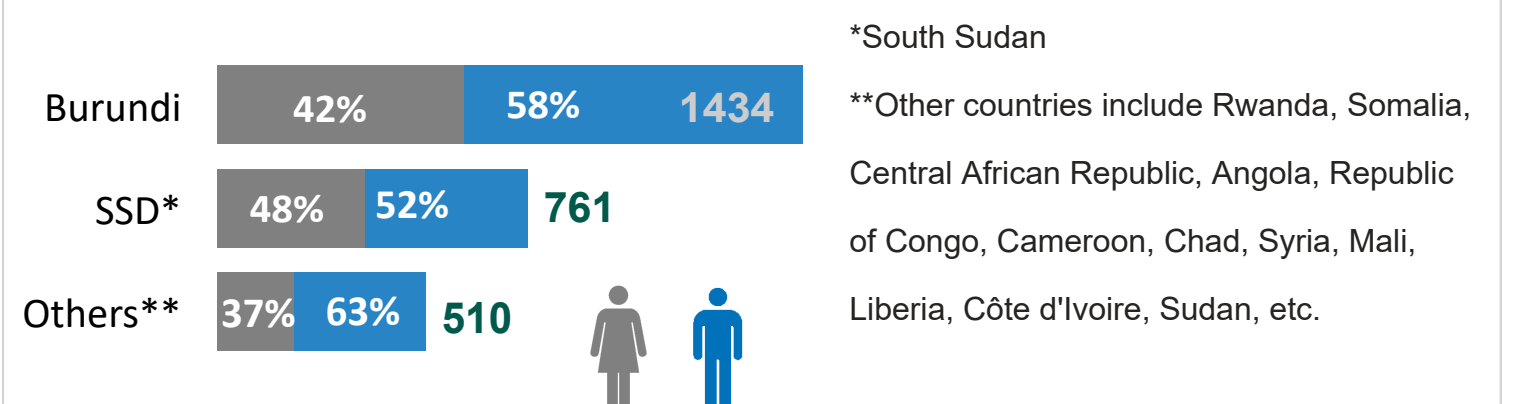

Locations of Refugee Population in DRC



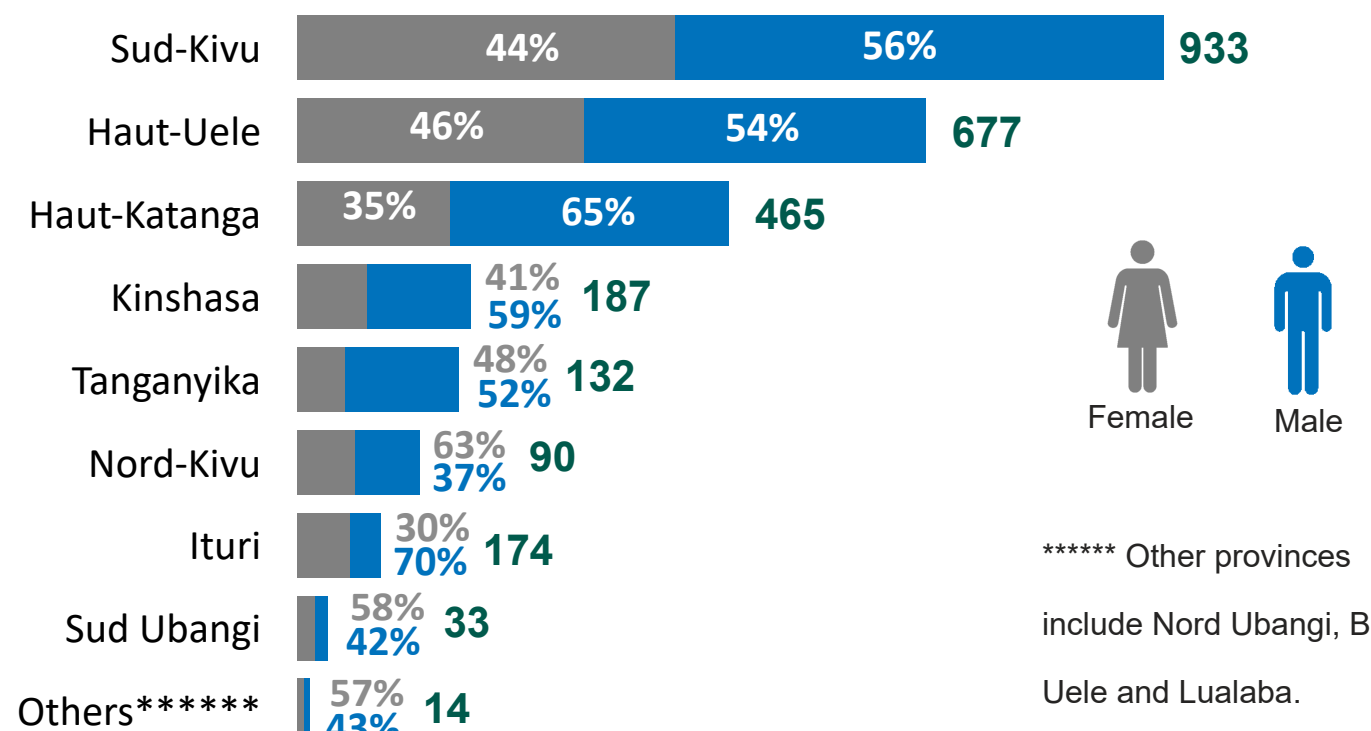
Asylum Seekers Population by Country of Origin

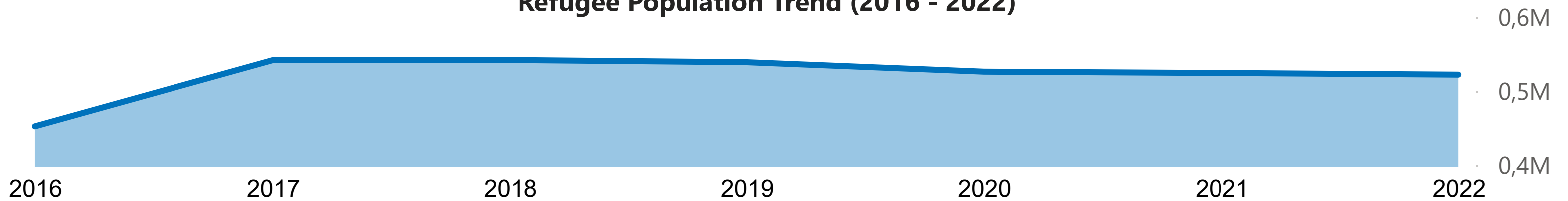

C) Documentation (issued by the Government): 59,628 refugees in the DRC aged 12 years and over all have refugee identity cards, representing 34% of the total population eligible for identity cards, equal to **173,306** persons. **306,803** refugees and asylum seekers have protection documents, representing 59% of the total population of refugees and asylum seekers in the DRC (518,505 people).

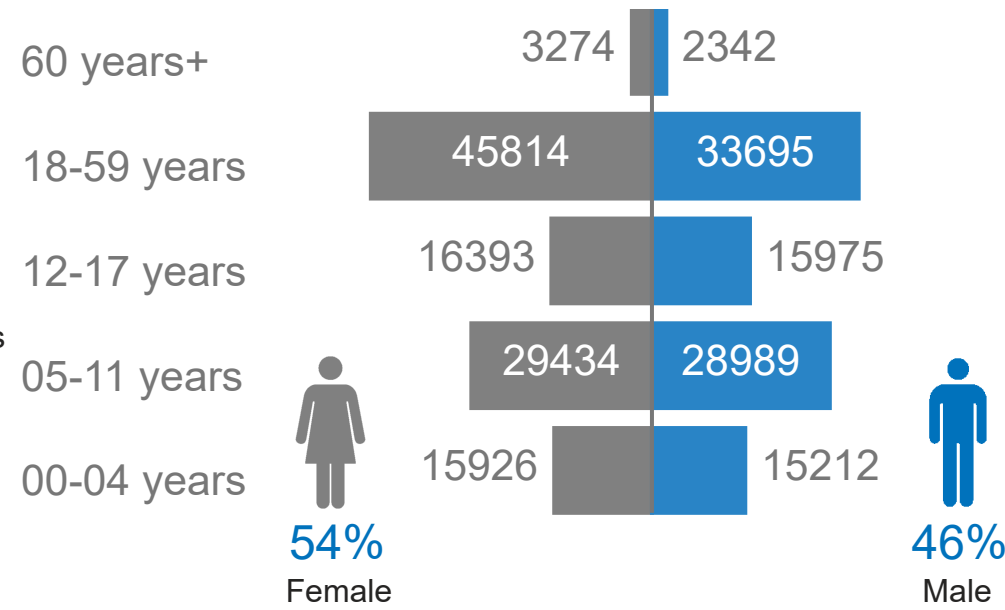

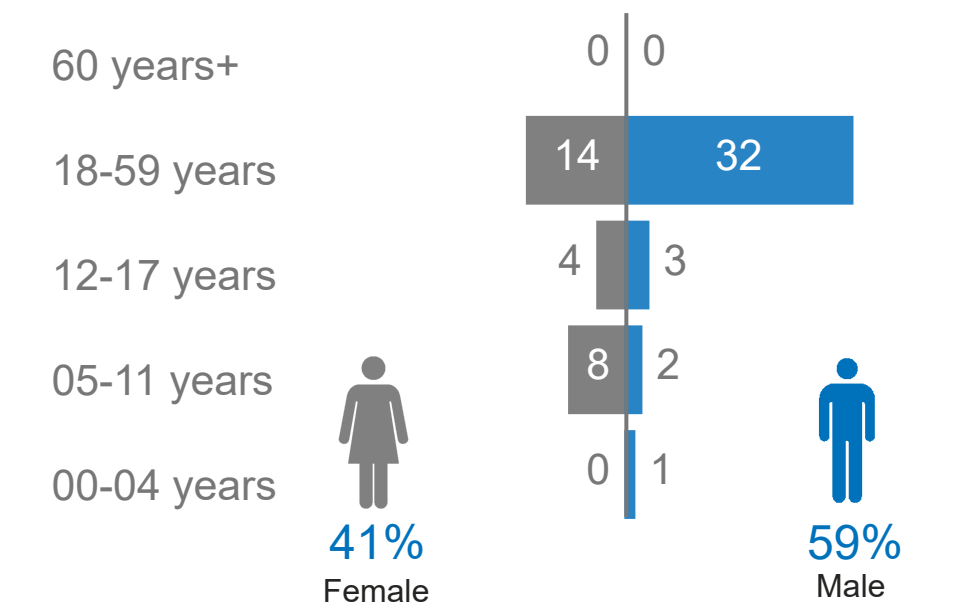

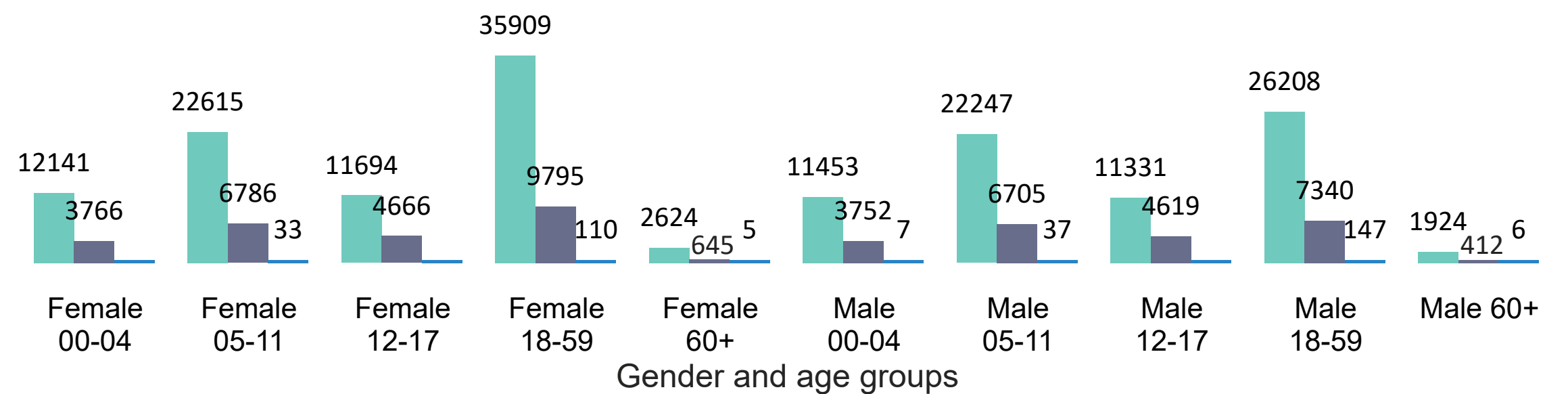


Central African Refugee Population by Type of Location

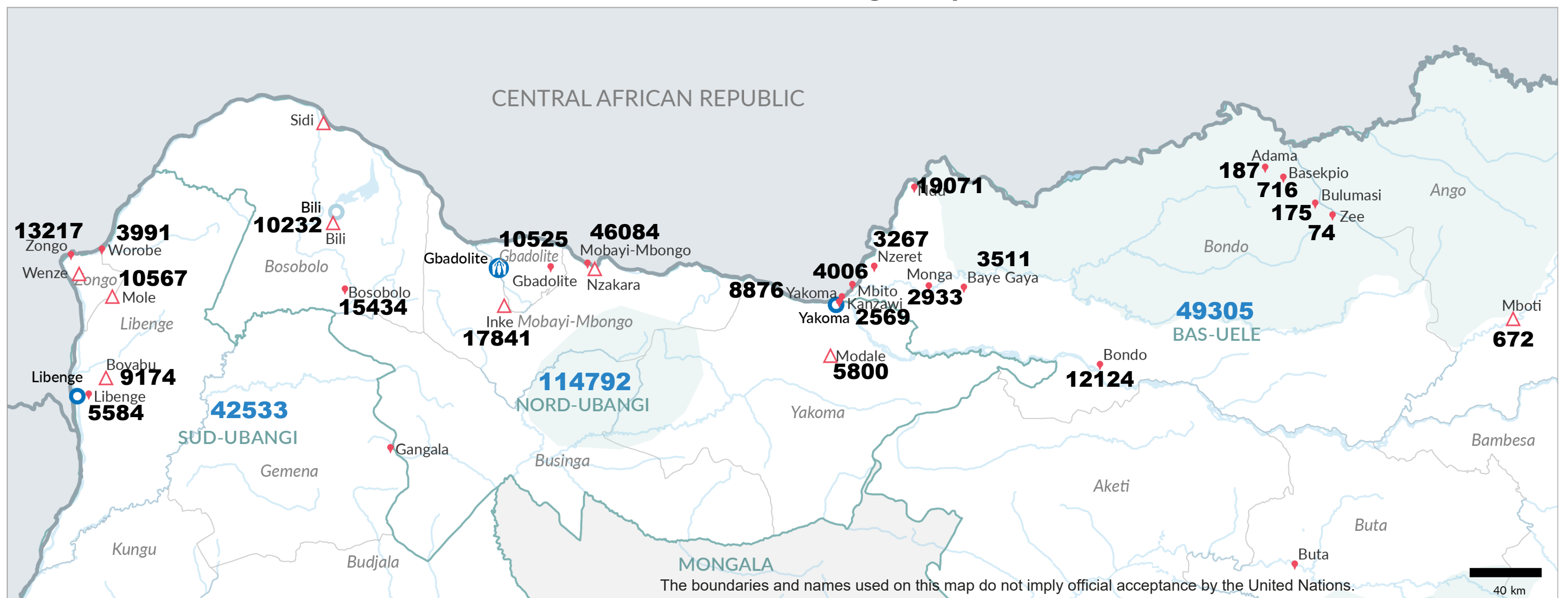

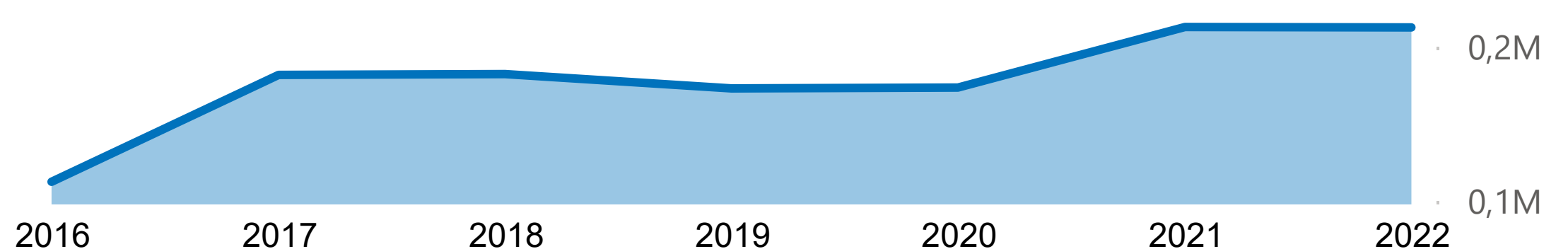

Comments about the figures of Central African refugees

The number of Central African refugees and asylum seekers in the DRC is 207,118 [207,054 refugees and 64 asylum seekers]. 114,792 refugees and asylum seekers in the province of Nord Ubangi, 42,533 in Sud Ubangi and 49,305 in Bas Uélé, 479 in Kinshasa, 6 in Haut-Katanga, 2 in Haut-Uele and 1 in North Kivu. All Central African refugees and asylum seekers have identity documents issued by the CNR with the technical support of UNHCR.

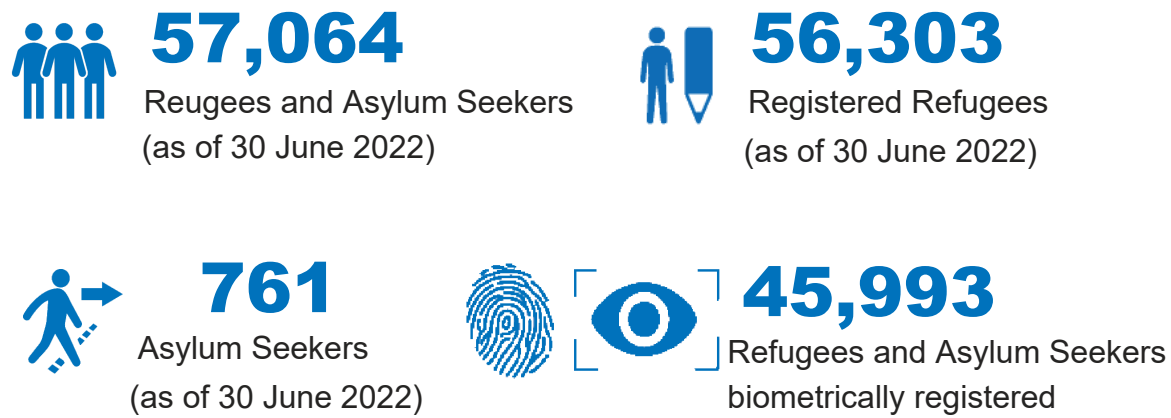

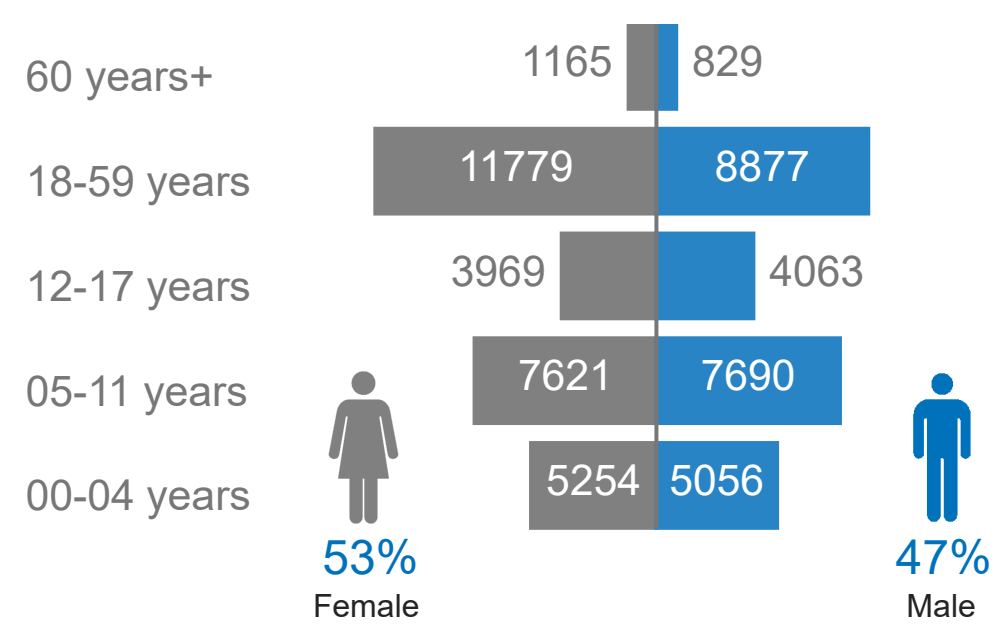

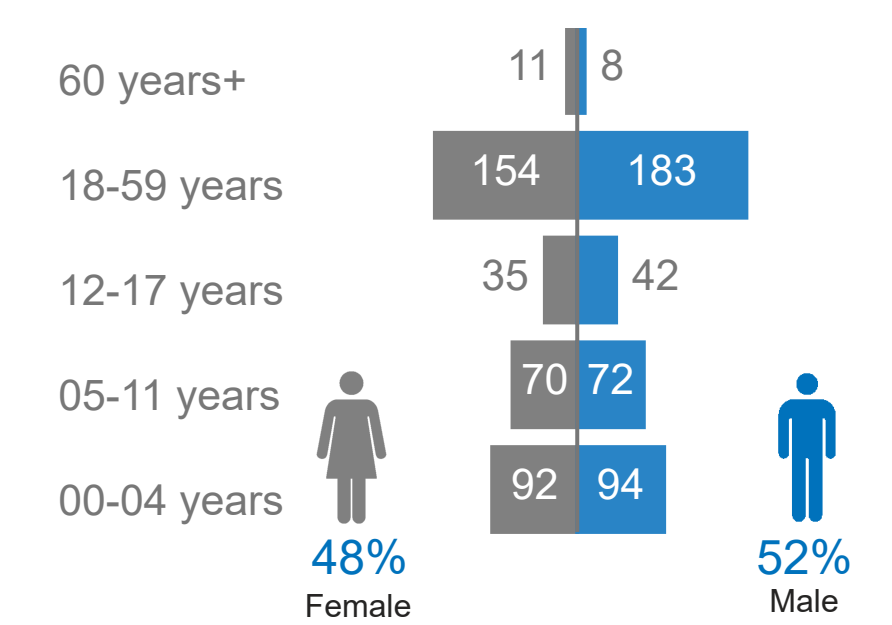

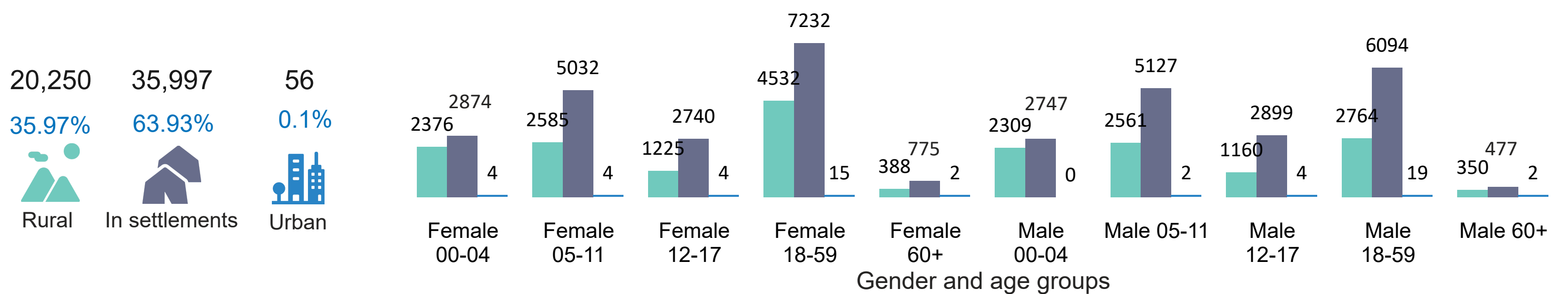
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



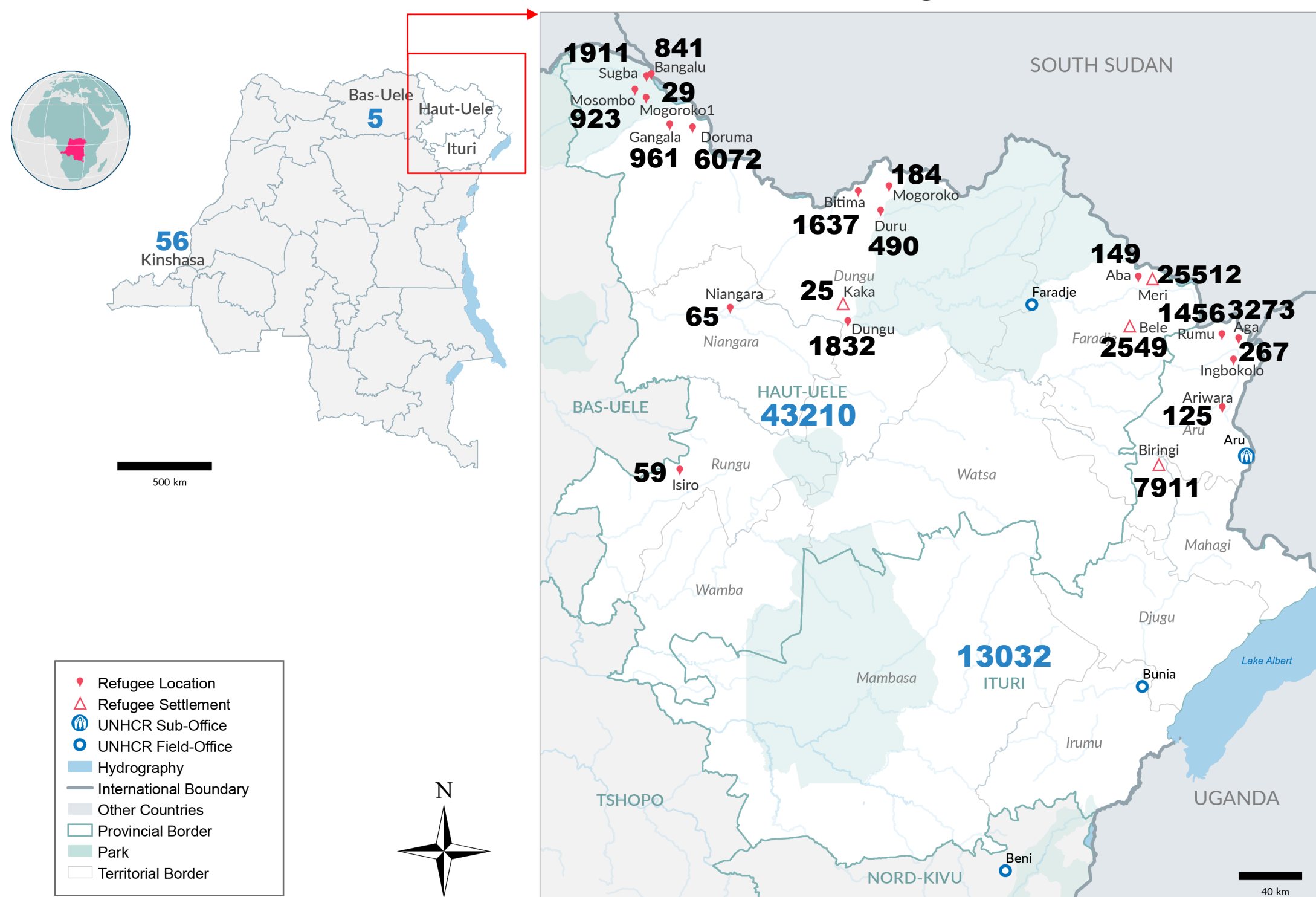
Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers



South Sudanese Refugee Population by Type of Location

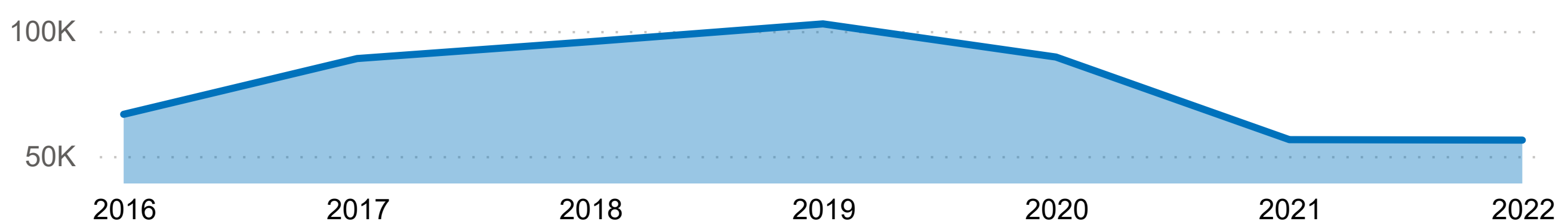


Location of South Sudanese Refugees in DRC

Comments about the figures of South Sudanese refugees

The number of South Sudanese refugees and asylum seekers in DRC is 57,064. The situation of the South Sudanese refugee population remained stable in June.

The overall figures of our South Sudanese beneficiaries who are in our 3 sites (Biringi, Meri and Bele) are a total of 36,703 or 65% of the overall SSD population (56,303).

All the refugees living in the 3 sites have identity documents issued by the CNR with the technical support of UNHCR.

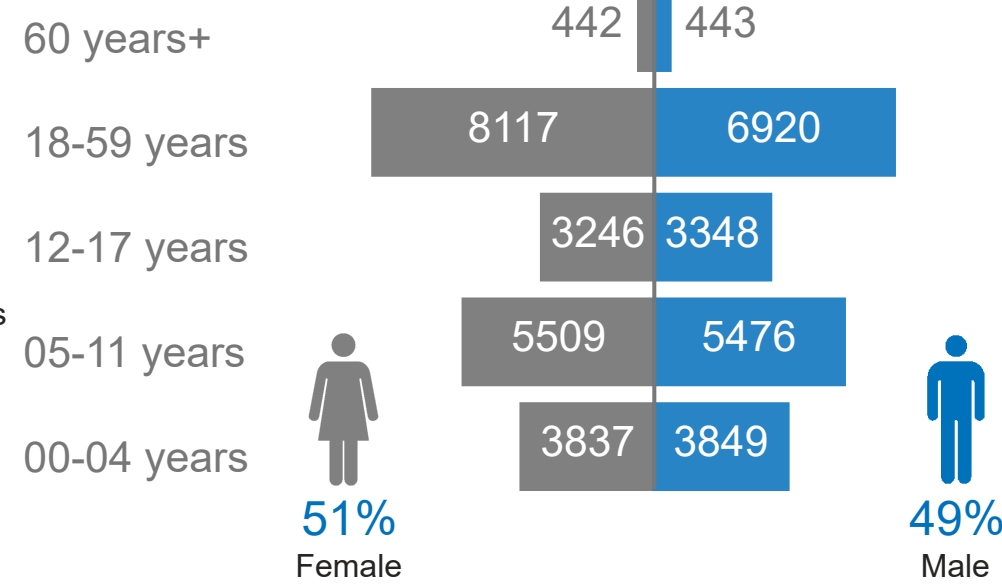

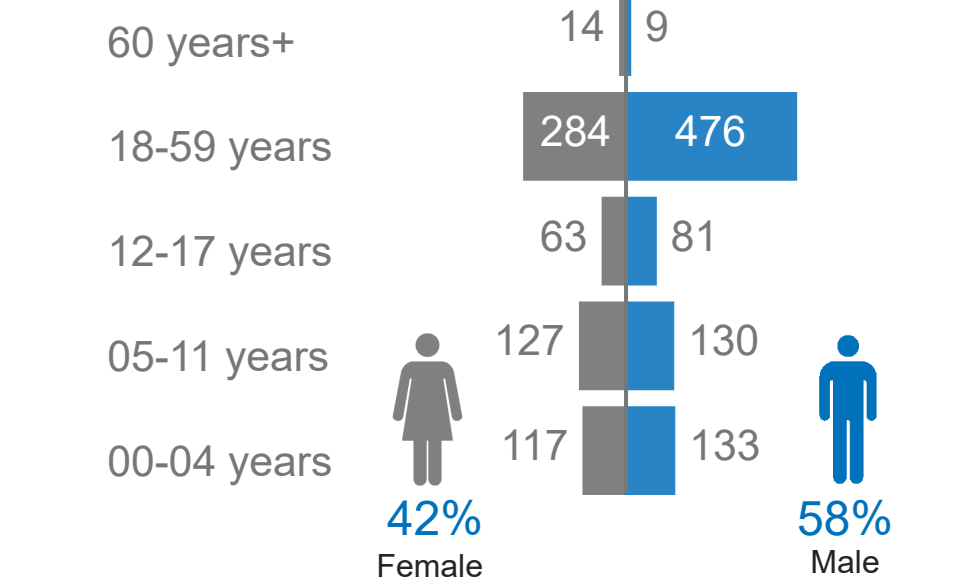

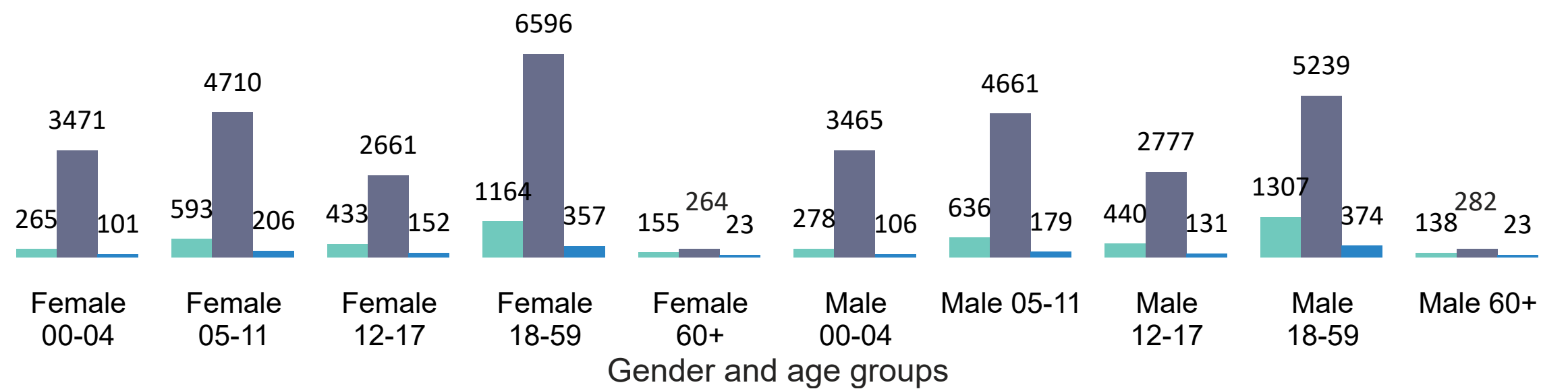


Burundian Refugee Population by Type of Location

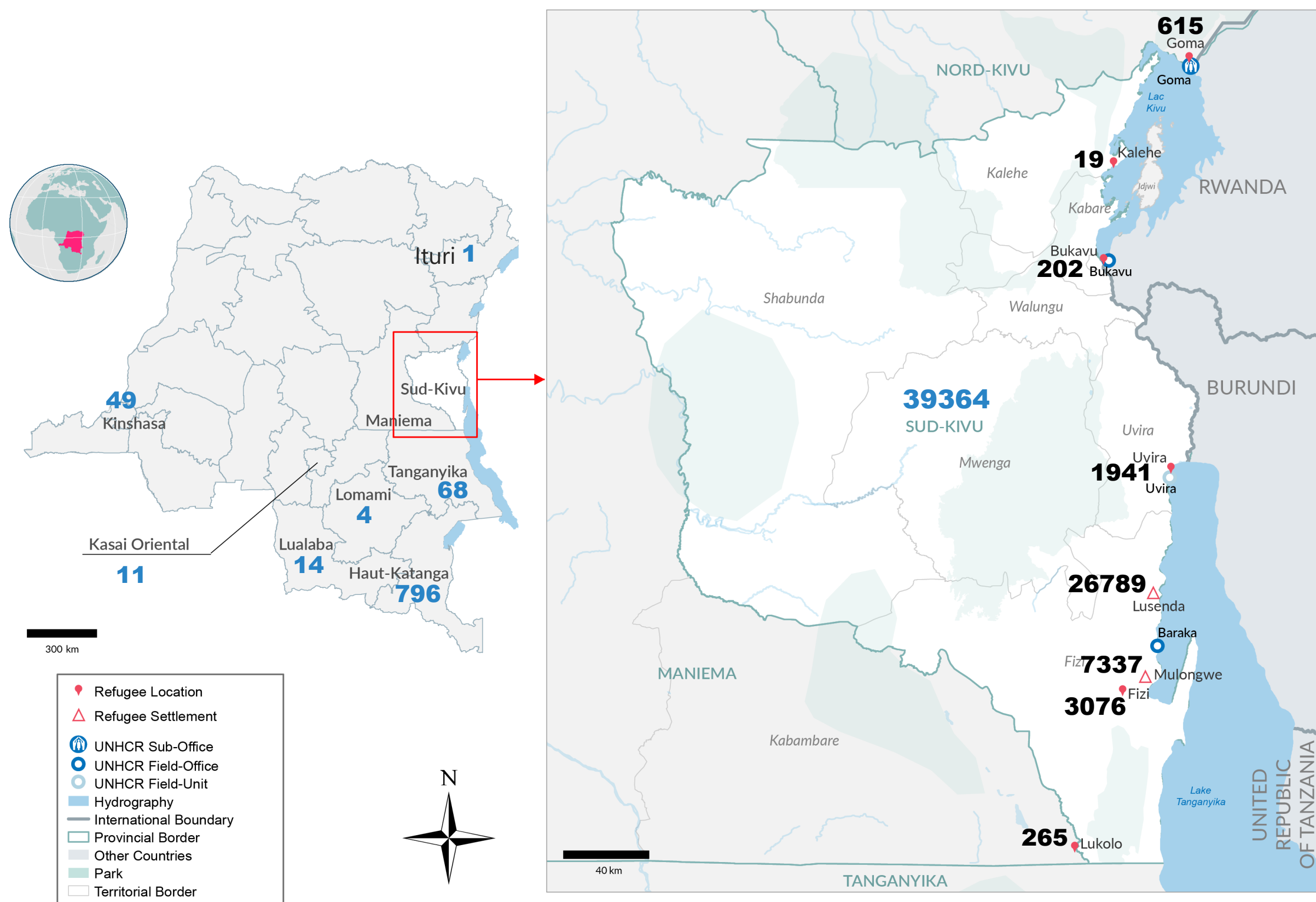

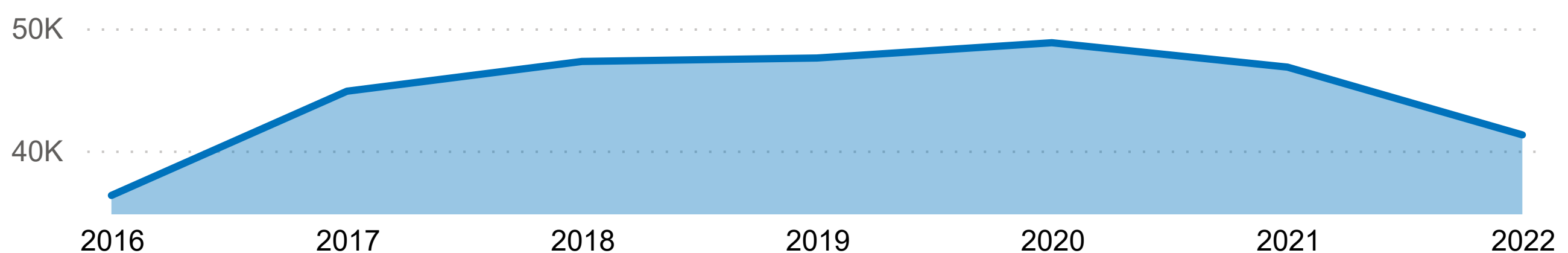


Location of Burundian Refugees in DRC

Comments about the figures of Burundian refugees

The number of refugees and asylum seekers still in DRC is equal to 42,621 [41,187 refugees and 1,434 asylum seekers]. This decrease is due to some cases of inactivation and repatriation. All Burundian refugees have identity documents issued by the CNR with technical support from UNHCR. Burundian refugees were repatriated during the month of June. 1,284 Burundian refugees were repatriated to their country of origin.
